REFORMATION SUNDAY: Today we celebrate Reformation Sunday. The Reformation began on October 31, 1517, when German monk Martin Luther nailed his 95 Theses to the church door in Wittenberg, Germany. This began the last great revival of true Christianity in world history. When summoned to appear before the Emperor at the Diet of Worms in April of 1521 to answer for his writings, Luther gave his timeless reply, "I do not accept the authority of popes and councils, for they have contradicted each other—my conscience is captive to the Word of God. I cannot and I will not recant anything, for to go against conscience is neither right nor safe. Here I stand, I can do no other. God help me, Amen." The five pillars of the Reformation, on which our theology is based today, are that through Christ alone we are reconciled to God; the Bible alone is the Word of God; faith alone is all that saves us; grace alone is all that has made it possible; and to God alone be the glory.
