Paraments

Trinity Season is the longest season of the church year. Upon the Pulpit Fall is sewn the Triquetra, an ancient symbol of the Trinity, dating from the earliest days of Christianity. The Triquetra is three ovals, all equal, intersecting and interwoven, so that although each is clearly defined, there is no beginning or end, no divisibility of this figure. Each intersecting arc results in the shape of a fish, an ancient symbol for Christians. In the Triquetra, the truth of the Trinity is shown as is the eternal nature of God in the continuous line of the symbol, uniting three figures in One, the Triune God, Three in One. On the Bible Markers are embroidered in gold the letters IHS, monogram for Jesus. The green paraments of Trinity Season will remain until the first Sunday in Advent.

Weekly Focus on Mission Partners

World Missions: Jonathan and Fozia are with EPC World Outreach in an Asian country. April and May have been very busy months including a special visit from their home church pastor and his wife.
