Their first church plant in Montigny where Bill was pastor and their three boys grew up, developed to the point that it was joyfully turned over to French leadership. In 2008 Bill and Bobbie planted their second church in Guyancourt. The church, a core group of about 20 which meets in the only hotel in Guyancourt, is growing and having baptisms and conversions. Bill, TEAM France's Area leader, has the team developing a new church planting strategy. Bobbie teaches English to students — which provides opportunities for good spiritual discussions. Pray for a much-needed permanent place for the Guyancourt church and for the spiritual life of the Bill and Bobbie's three boys who live in the U.S.

Mission Memphis: Advance Memphis requests that we join them in prayer for 18 JFL (Jobs for Life) participants — that they will experience freedom through the Gospel of Jesus, which will enable them to work hard and invest in their futures.
